

Dear Teachers, Administration, Students, Parents/ Guardians,

Thank you for taking the time to review our updated packet. The guiding principle of kindness has been the foundation of the Farm School and the Program for Visiting Schools for over 30 years. The recent updates to this packet help us work toward cultivating that space deeply and intentionally in various ways and are a natural outgrowth of The Farm School's desire to deepen our understanding and awareness around race, equity and liberation; how each of these intersections show up at the farm, for visitors to the farm and for us as individuals connected to the broader society.

Our 4 goals around this work are to build and strengthen our relationships, begin developing a shared language and analysis of systemic oppression, power and privilege, deepen our historical understanding as to how race and racism intersect with other forms of oppression and practice together in real time the work of equity and liberation. Among many agreements that hold us in this work, we aim to keep each other and our partners in grace, to push beyond our growing edges and to recognize the need for depth without drowning, knowing there are no quick fixes and trusting the process. This letter reflects where we currently are and is an invitation for you to know we are in this work.

Honoring Gender Identity

The Farm School began a process in the 2019-20 school year of making our bunk room space non gender specific, working directly with partner schools to customize use of the bunkhouse space in ways that honor the identities of the youth, in partnership with school administration and parents. Please look for more information once we are able to re-open overnight programming.

English Language and interpretation

Please inform us if English interpretation will be needed for any youth, if that child's peers are supporting in English interpretation or if a designated teacher will accompany the child/ren for interpretation support. If no peer or teacher support is available and you have a child in need of English language support please let us know so we can discuss a plan to make sure the



student is aware of where things are around the farm and what we are doing each day.

Ability and Mobility around the farm

We have 1 ADA approved shower and bathroom. Main/floor level sleeping bunks are available on the west side and east side bunk rooms. Wheelchair and ramp access is available on the west side bunk area. A mobile ramp is also available.

Work is spread out across the farm and navigation and travel across gravel roads and woody trails may be needed to access work areas and various parts of the farm. Please notify us if any mobility considerations are needed.



Hello!

It's been such a thrill to have kids back on the farm for overnight trips this summer and we can't wait to continue sharing the farm with you this Fall.

With the announcement of the Massachusetts State of Emergency ending June 15, COVID-19 restrictions being lifted across the state and after consultation with the State Department of Health, we plan to reopen at our full capacity for the 2021 - 2022 school year.

We understand that each of our partner schools will be back to school this year with COVID -19 guidelines that are unique to their school community and we'd like to work with you to offer an experience on the farm that matches the health and safety precautions that you will have in place when kids return this fall. Here's what we can ensure will be in place on our end for your visit:

- -- The bunkhouse will only be entered by your students/teachers and fully vaccinated and/or masked Farm School personnel during your visit.
- -- A separate space will be provided for any students that present COVID-19 symptoms while on the farm.
- -- New air filtration units will be in each of the bunkrooms.
- -- As always, the vast majority of our programming and meals (as weather allows) will happen outdoors.
- -- Showers and bathroom areas, sleeping areas, bed surfaces and any shared items will be cleaned and disinfected in accordance with <u>CDC Guidance</u>.
- -- Farm School staff will perform regular health screenings and will not report to work/engage in any programming if at all symptomatic.

As has always been the case, The Farm School will rely on its partner schools to arrange for parental permissions and to administer all medications to their students while they are at the farm. In accordance with this, any and all COVID-19 testing practices for schools attending The Farm School will be the responsibility of the schools themselves. At a minimum, as we put into practice ourselves for our overnight programs this summer in order to decrease the risk of sleeping unmasked in the bunkrooms, The Farm School will request that sending schools have unvaccinated students obtain a negative PCR test within 72 hours of coming to the farm and a negative BinaxNow test, administered by the sending school staff, upon arrival at the farm and if any symptoms arise while at the farm. We will, of course, be happy to go over any and all of this with you ahead of your visit, if you like!

We also appreciate your understanding that The Farm School's programming and capacity is subject to change based on any future COVID-19 guidance and directives from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (DPH), and local boards of health.

I understand that this event will take place away from the grounds of Gordon School, and my child will be under the supervision of the designated employees on the stated dates.
